Creating Connections 2.0 builds on the success of the 2009 Creating Connections Symposium at Loon Lake. This year, WWEST is aiming to reach a wider geographic region and ensure that all B.C. and Yukon women in engineering have a chance to participate in the event. Our goal is to increase participants' belief in their ability to succeed in their careers - their career self-efficacy - and thereby increase retention rates in the profession. The desired outcome is to achieve a minimum of 75% of conference participants showing an increase in career self-efficacy.

This conference needs your support to succeed. Your company benefits from the diverse perspective and abilities that female engineers bring to a project team. Female engineers show a greater likelihood to stay in the profession if they are mentored, encouraged and supported.
